Kaiser Permanente provided grant funding to community health centers to increase their capacity to serve people in need, help stop the spread of the COVID-19 virus, connect individuals and families to community resources, and support population health management approaches that improve health outcomes.

We supported healthy food incentive programs, enrollment in CalFresh, California's food stamp program, and medically tailored meal programs.
